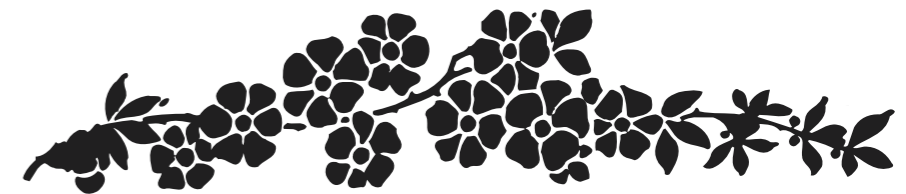

GERALD P. FISHER

Known to friends and colleagues as Geep, Gerald P. Fisher, 57, was a part of the Booz Allen family for 14 years, working on many projects as a manpower specialist and serving as a principal with the firm. He touched many of our lives during his tenure with the firm.

He was born in New York City, grew up in Los Angeles, and was a resident of Potomac, Maryland. Geep had over 30 years of experience in government, academia, and private industry, including six years as an associate professor at the universities of Texas and Wisconsin. He received a doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania in social welfare and earned Master's degrees from the University of Pennsylvania in city planning and California State University in social welfare, as well as a Bachelor's degree from San Francisco State College.

Geep is survived by Christine Fisher, his wife of 17 years, his first wife Bonnie Fisher, and their children, Jonathan Michael Fisher, 29, and Serena Leigh Dugan, 28.

TERENCE M. LYNCH

Terence M. Lynch, 49, joined Booz Allen two years ago as an associate with the firm's Organization & Management Team. Based on his excellent performance, he was being promoted to senior associate this fall.

Terry was born in Youngstown, Ohio, and received Master's and Bachelor's degrees in history from Youngstown State University. He worked in the federal government for 20 years, as an aide to Senator Richard C. Shelby of Alabama, from 1983 to 1995, and with various agencies and organizations, including the Senate Intelligence Committee and the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee. As an aide to Senator Shelby, Terry helped draft legislation establishing a National Institutes of Health research program on juvenile rheumatic diseases.

Terry, a resident of Alexandria, Virginia, is survived by his wife of 24 years, Jacqueline, and their daughters, Tiffany Marie, 22, and Ashley Nicole, 17.

ERNEST M. WILLCHER

In April 2001, Ernest M. Willcher, 62, retired after 25 years as a civilian employee with the Army. In May he joined Booz Allen as an associate with the Organization & Management Team, where he continued working for military clients and brought his expertise in legal issues to Booz Allen projects.

Ernie served in the United States Army for four years and spent 36 years as a civilian employee in several postings.
